Prompt Delivery

Combine constructive criticism with positive reinforcement, acknowledging learners' efforts and strengths.

Group Projects

Online Discussion Forums

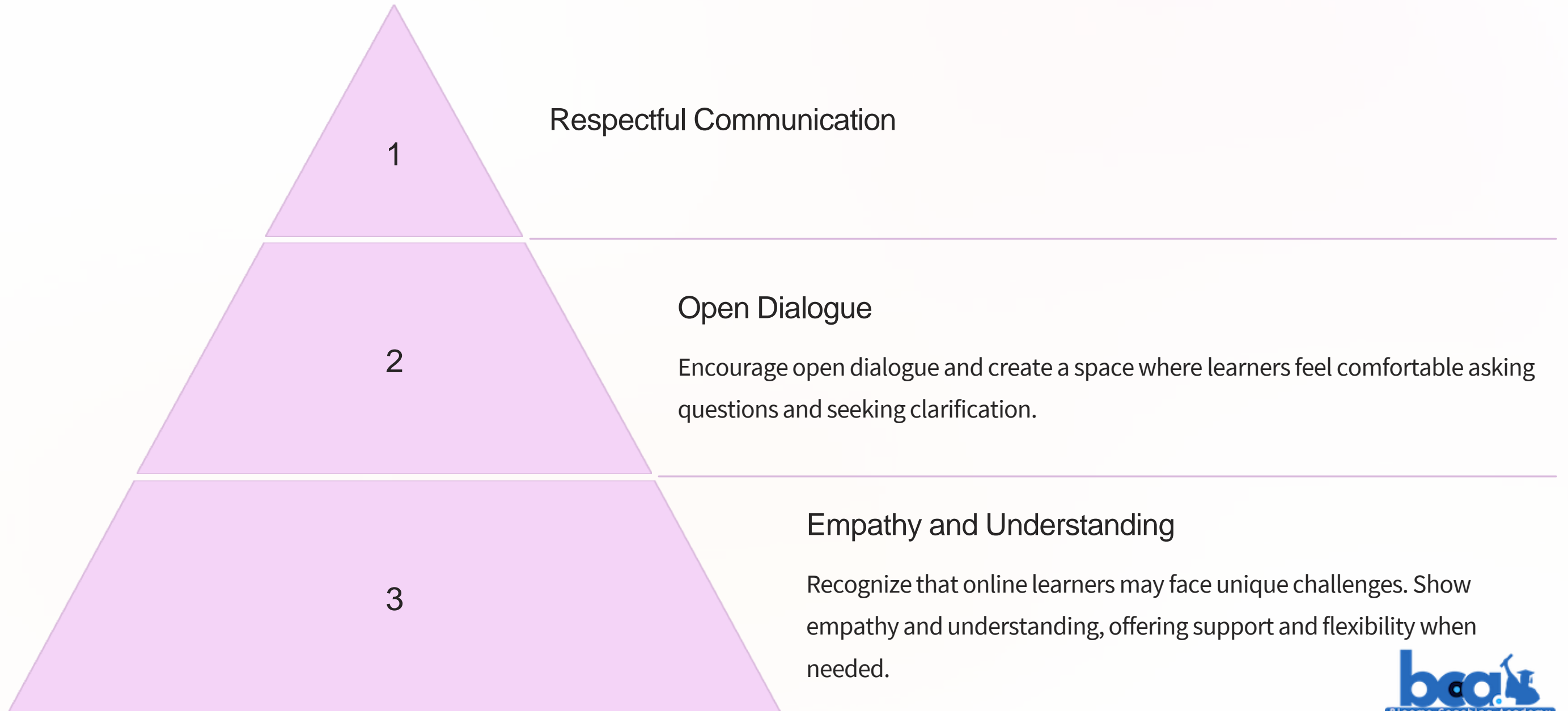
Create online forums where learners can ask questions, share insights, and provide feedback to each other. This promotes a sense of community and fosters a supportive learning environment.

Identifying and Addressing Barriers to Learning
